What you can expect from SCOUTS

Joining

On your first visit you will receive this information about SCOUTS and a Consent and Application to Join form to complete. Your child has 3 free visits to decide if SCOUTS is for them before they are invested.

Investiture

New members make the Promise and are then presented with the Group scarf, a woggle and a membership certificate.

Members are required to have a uniform and an award book for the ceremony.

Sometimes uniforms are available second hand. Please discuss with the Leaders the uniform and how it should be worn.

Subscriptions

Subs are levied to assist in meeting the fixed costs of running the Scout Group, support and organisation from the Regional Office, National Office and support from the World Scout Organisation. Like most voluntary organisations fundraising is done on a regular basis to meet specific events and projects where your assistance is most welcome. Some events may attract their own charge, full details will be provided prior to the event.

SCOUT FACTS...

Many of our volunteers were not SCOUTS when they were younger but have learned new skills and made new friends through SCOUTS.

There are roles to suit most interests and a sense of satisfaction to be gained through providing existing skills to assist youth development.

What SCOUTS can expect from you

Safety

Safety to and from meetings at our Scout Hall is important. Please make suitable transit arrangements. Car-pooling works well for some parents. Please let the Leader know when you may have a delayed pick up or if someone else will be providing the transport.

Absence

If your child is absent for any reason please call us.

Behaviour

Good behaviour is the responsibility of the child, parent and leaders. Everyone is expected to cooperate, follow instructions, and treat people and property with respect. Leaders use positive reinforcement and a reward system to encourage appropriate behaviour.

Parent Help

The Leaders and Committee of the Group firmly believe that parents and caregivers have an important role to play in supporting youth and the Group.
